5 CRIME/NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH

6 COUNTY/DISTRICT COUNCILLOR

Cllr Lewis reported that the SSDC planning situation is still quite difficult. SSDC are looking at ICT to deliver all services which is difficult for older members of the community to access, all issues should be raised with SSDC. The transformation programme should be complete by September, with new ways of working also completed by then.

Queen Camel Parish Council are looking to engage more than they have been recently on the A303 consultation. Jo Manley has now left SSDC but hopefully another member of the team will be able to support the remainder of the process.

SCC ended the financial year in credit of £1.4m. They are looking at the gritting offer for next winter and information will be circulated in due course.

7 HIGHWAYS

Street lights 4, 10, 11 and 19 at the High Street are not working. Due to the road closure vehicles have been using Sparkford Hill Lane so the road now requires urgent repairs. A request would be made to SCC to do these repairs as soon the road closure

 9 PLANNING APPLICATIONS a) 19/00903/HOU Alterations, the erection of a single storey rear extension, new dormer window and rooflight to rear. 11 Ainstey Drive, Sparkford This application is still being circulated so comments will be made at a later date. 	
10 MATTERS ARISING NOT INCLUDED IN OTHER SECTIONS a) McDonalds and Hazelgrove Services outstanding issues update Sarah was brought up to speed with previous issues/concerns. Rubbish/vermin have been an issue recently and there are ongoing issues with and concerns about parking on the road and overnight parking of HGV's at the site. Sarah is looking to put forward a proposal to change the HGV area to car parking. TT advised that if this was approved sufficient space for cars/caravans to turn would need to be incorporated. Auto number plate recognition has now been installed and during the Easter weekend staff were sited with radios in the car park assisting with traffic management. There is a rubbish collection route through the village but Sarah agreed to investigate the area that is litter.

contributions for village hall as they are listed on the Council's Regulation 123 list. TT felt strongly that a meeting was needed to discuss this further so LP agreed to contact Lynda Pincombe at SSDC to arrange a meeting within the next two weeks to discuss future contributions.	LP
c) A303 dualling proposals Another joint meeting has been held to discuss the response. Highways England are not prepared to answer questions asked by the Inspector and are refusing to overlay our proposal onto theirs. Highways England are also failing to provide evidence of all correspondence with the MOD. Unfortunately there is no support from SCC. Fairhurst have advised that the parallel road could be achieved y taking 1.5m of MOD land. We could be heading for a legal challenge against Highways England depending on the Planning Inspectors response. It was	
agreed that TT would ask Jo Wilkins for support for the three parishes as SSDC are more likely to provide this than SCC as they have been absent from discussions to date.	TT
 d) Parish Insurance The insurance quote was agreed e) Grit bins TT suggested that additional bins are necessary.
